

MPUMALANGA GOLF UNION
APPROVED CODE OF CONDUCT – 19 NOVEMBER 2016

- 1. Dress Code on the Golf Course:**
 - 1.1 The following are the dress regulations for all Mpumalanga Tournaments :
 - 1.2 ON THE COURSE :**
 - 1.2.1 All shirts must have a collar – No T shirts or vest like tops will be allowed. Shirts must be tucked in. Branded polo collar shirts are permissible.
 - 1.2.2 Golf long trousers with socks. Jeans or the like are not permitted.
 - 1.2.3 Golf shorts with long hose or white short socks ankle high are permitted. No Bermuda/multi coloured shorts allowed.
 - 1.2.4 Golf shoes only – no running or tennis shoes permitted.
 - 1.2.5 Any jersey, windbreaker, golf cap/hat worn must be neat, tidy and clean.
 - 1.2.6 Golf bags/ carts must be in a presentable condition/state.
- 2. PRIZE GIVING FUNCTION:**
 - 2.1 MGU players should attend all tournament prize giving functions. Requests to be excused will be denied. Dress is smart casual – shoes and socks must be worn.
- 3. PUNISHABLE OFFENCES – ON THE COURSE OR ON/IN ITS PREMISES. AN IMMEDIATE THREE MONTH SUSPENSION – FOLLOWED BY A DISCIPLINARY HEARING ASAP. PLAYER IMMEDIATELY SUSPENDED. HANDICAP TO BE FROZEN IMMEDIATELY.**
 - 3.1
 - 3.1.1 Failure to arrive at a tournament – no apology tendered – player is still liable for entry fee.
 - 3.1.2 Throwing clubs/badly behaved – warning for first offence.
 - 3.1.3 Using foul, abusive or racist language – warning first offence.
 - 3.1.4 Walking off the course without a valid reason.
 - 3.1.5 Threatening violence, fighting or brawling.
 - 3.1.6 Consuming liquor or taking drugs on the course. Here officials must be alert and strict.
 - 3.1.7 Conduct unbecoming of a player/ bringing the game into disrepute.
 - 3.1.8 Purposely damaging the course or greens.
- 4. ONE YEAR SENTENCE - SUBJECT TO A DISCIPLINARY HEARING. PLAYER IMMEDIATELY SUSPENDED.**
 - 4.1 A second offence of clause 3.
 - 4.2 A serious breach of the Rules of Golf and/or unbecoming conduct.
 - 4.3 Blatant cheating.
 - 4.4 Player manipulating his handicap.
- 5. CLUB GUILTY OF NEGLIGENCE – MUST BE SUBJECT TO A DISCIPLINARY HEARING.**
 - 5.1** If a club fails to inform a club member of his starting time and destination in a MGU tournament – the player must be representing his club - the club shall be liable to a minimum fine of R250 and maximum fine of R500. The club is also liable for their entry fee if the player/team fails to arrive. Players can only enter Mpumalanga events on the official entry form - a club official must verify the player's handicap and sign the form.
- 6. DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE – PANEL ELECTED AT AGM ANNUALLY.**
 - 6.1 A player summoned to appear at a Disciplinary Hearing must receive details of what he is charged with in writing – the charge must be in detail and must be **delivered by hand or e mail at least 72 hours** before the hearing.
 - 6.2 The player has the right to appeal against the outcome and must do so within 7 days of the hearing.
 - 6.3 The player has the right to be represented by a **competent person** and may produce witnesses on his behalf at the hearing.
 - 6.4 Any player whose appeal fails then has the right to appeal to the MGU Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 7. GENERAL.**
 - 7.1 Any offence or breach of the Rules not covered by the above shall be dealt with by the Executive Committee. This includes Mpumalanga players representing other Unions at Provincial level.
 - 7.2 If a player violates the condition of his suspension he will then serve out the original sentence and an additional **ONE YEAR** – subject to a disciplinary hearing.
 - 7.3 All players in Mpumalanga are expected to be familiar with the **MGU Code of Conduct**.
 - 7.4 Any club official/MGU Executive Member breaching any of the above will be charged under 4.2.
 - 7.5 The MGU Code of Conduct overrides any MGU club code of conduct.**
 - 7.6 Clubs must adopt the MGU Code and outcome of guilty players/officials must be consistent. Club to immediately freeze the handicap of a player found guilty
 - 7.7 During the timeframe of an appeal and the final outcome of the case the accused may **not play any golf at all**.

The Code of Conduct was sent to attorney Jonathan Stockwell of Werkmans firm of Attorneys in Johannesburg on 21 November 2016 requesting him to peruse the Code with the aim to upgrade it to ensure that it could stand up in a court of law. It was approved by them on 18 January 2017 as is.
